We have enjoyed learning sounds and listening to stories with Mrs Woodhouse. We have also enjoyed learning about the planets in the solar system. We are learning to listen to adults and take turns sharing.

ROBINS



Reception have settled in well to school life. They have been enjoying their Little Wandle Phonics sessions, learning sounds ready to read and write.

All children have been engaging well with our learning theme of Space, Weather and Seasons. We have learned that the sun is in he centre of our solar system; it is a star and all of the planets orbit it. We have also looked at each of the 8 planets in depth to learn what they are like.

Children are working on their independence during their learning and resilience to try themselves before asking an adult.

A big well done to the children reading regularly at home; it really shows in reading sessions.

FLAMINGOES

Flamingoes are settling well into the new year, with our high expectations of attainment and behaviour. Everyone is enjoying our new learning theme of Stone Age to Iron Age and we have already a few texts in English that link closely to this. In History, we have so far learned about what led up to the Stone Age—the creation of the earth, the era of the dinosaurs, the last Ice Age, early man and the evolution of animals.

Swimming is going well, with everyone participating fully. Homework is mostly being completed on time—so thank you for your continued support. Our Class focus is the learning, retention and application of spellings. Please spend time with your child reviewing and testing them. Look for patterns and rules each week so that children feel more confident with their spelling knowledge.

- ⇒ All children need their home-school learning books in school every day please especially on a Monday ready for spelling tests.
